Dear Friends of Second Church,

Once again, we're looking forward to welcoming all members to the church Annual Meeting at 11:45 on Sunday — please join us with open hearts and discerning minds as we offer a snapshot on the state of the church and ask you to study and ultimately bless the budget for 2024.

For those homebound or out of pocket because of travel, **we will also have a Zoom link available** so you can attend the meeting virtually — including the ability to vote remotely and ask questions/voice support/raise concerns. We just ask for a margin of grace as we attempt this hybrid format for the first time — we have dutifully practiced, we promise — but we remain learners as we seek to broaden access to the business of the church. Despite our best efforts, cameras and microphones and shared screens may glitch, although we pray they won't.

Also, in order to maintain strong cyber-security, we will not publish the link here (in a quasi-public space), so if you'd like to attend via Zoom, simply email Pam in the church office (<u>pam@2cc.org</u>), and we will be sure to send you the link via email later this week. (We need you to tell us by noon on Friday, February 2.)

Finally, in the news last week, you may have seen pictures of the catastrophic roof collapse at what was the First Congregational Church of New London, a congregation even older than our own, but like us, housed in a historic stone structure with a slate roof in a prominent location.

It's unclear if the "founding congregation" was still active in that specific place, but as you will have seen if you caught the news item, there was another congregation resident there, and while they'd come in more recently, they loved the old church very much and were delighted to be part of a promising next chapter. Likewise, while the broader community may not have worshiped there, they viewed the building with great affection and no small amount of gratitude, both for its beauty and for its ongoing work at making the city a better place to live for everybody.

Rest assured, we keep a close eye on the church roof, among many other things.

But it is always the people of a church who make it come alive.

It may not always seem as if our church, or any other, should really lay claim to the old language of its people as "gathered by God."

That can sound pretty prideful, particularly because in the daily comings and goings, Christianity can sometimes feel like a life to which we **aspire** more than one we can unhesitatingly claim to be living. ("Can't you all see how **Christian** we are?!") To me, that's too severe and sets the bar higher for ourselves than God seems to.

God rejoices at our faithfulness in the trying. God sees great possibilities in our encountering one another and learning to work together. God is patient and willing to take the long view, and eager to see the holiness in small moments along the way.

We are so grateful for our building and for the faithful folks who left it as a legacy of their own time as the gathered community here.

...And *our* call is to understand God's hope for us in our own moment—to invite new inspiration into our life together and see what God would have *us* build—so that anyone who needs it will know just where to come.
