Dear Friends of Second Church,

Thanks to Georgia Harding, Suzy Starr, Bob Willett and his merry crew, the church is decked out for Christmas, and it looks terrific.

As you are turning your thoughts toward Christmas, we have two events this weekend that you should have on your radar.

First, our Gingerbread House Workshop on Saturday morning (see below).

One of the ways I mark the steady march of Greenwich's children toward adulthood is in the development of their gingerbread house-making.
