If we actually could line up those lists, we would probably get a window into how Christmas has changed, even within the span of our own years.

That can be as light and obvious as a Hallmark Christmas movie or as heavy and multilayered as our own most fraught relationship.

It's unclear to me if Ebeneezer Scrooge was isolated because he was greedy or greedy because he was isolated, but either way, the answer of Christmas was re-connection to family, community, and ultimately, to himself.

And for the Church, of course, the ultimate connection we celebrate at Christmas is the one between ourselves and God, whose love for us is particularly embodied in the person and work of Jesus.

Reconnecting with God, who wants so much to reconnect with us, is the possibility that

undergirds all the other possibilities (and promises) of Christmas.

As we ponder what to ask for this Christmas, there can be no better gift than a love that renews and inspires us, connecting and reconnecting our attention to the many gifts that surround us each day.
